Safer Internet Day 2024 will take place on the **6th February 2024**, with celebrations and learning based around the theme 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. Safer Internet Day is the UK's biggest celebration of online safety.

This year Safer Internet Day will be focusing on change online, this includes covering:

- Young people's perspective on new and emerging technology
- Using the internet to make change for the better
- The changes young people want to see online
- The things that can influence and change the way young people think, feel and act online and offline

During our Votes for School lessons, pupils will consider the "digital divide" between them and the adults in their lives, and to reflect on what we can learn from each other when it comes to the internet. Key Stage 1 pupils will have their say on: "Can adults and children learn from each other about the online world?", while Key Stage 2 pupils will decide: "Do adults have the tools to teach you about the online world?"

Advanced notification that our Easter Service will be held on the afternoon of **Monday 25**^h **March** at St John's Church, Ingleton. All are welcome.




